Practical requirements: International medical students will be able to:

- Prepare basic algorithm for public health emergency of international concern (PHEIC).
- Communicate algorithm for given PHEIC to the public.
- Select key three priorities for health systems of their home countries.

Requirements:

Active participation of students in seminars. Absence at seminars is tolerated up to 10 % of compulsory education without the need for apology or compensation. If a student missed additional hours of compulsory education for medical or other serious reason, student must present relevant apology and substitute for missing seminar(s). Relevance and possibility of the excuse is decided by the teacher.
