



Dear students,

I would like to say thank you to all of you who took part in the evaluation of teaching for the winter semester 2022/2023. 308 respondents (which is 13,1% of students) participated in the electronic evaluation and submitted 308 comments.

Below find some tips and instructions on how to display evaluation of individual courses, comments from students or reactions to such comments by teachers.

Log in to STAG, go to QUALITY OF TEACHING section [1], then click on PUBLISHED SURVEY RESULTS [2], portlet SEARCH COURSES [3] and select (using the "red +" button) [4] a department the evaluation results of which you want to explore. Once all courses taught by the given department are shown, select a particular course by clicking on the course abbreviation [5]. If you wish to see students' comments and teachers' reactions to them, go to the portlet STUDENTS' COMMENTS [6].
