Microbiology exam in the summer examination period

- Microbiology examination dates are scheduled from 01. 06. to 14. 09. 2020 and are available in STAG.
- In Czech study programmes General Medicine and Dentistry, a face-to-face examination will be preferred and an online examination will only be allowed in exceptional cases (based on prior arrangement via e-mail). An on-line exam must be arranged at least three days prior to the exam.
- In English study programmes General Medicine and Dentistry exams can be carried out face-to-face as well as online. Student has the right to choose a preferred form of the exam. Prior arrangement via email is necessary for online exams and must be done at least three days before the exam.
- An online exam will be done in form of 20-30 minute conversation between the
 examiner and the student. The examiner will ask questions and immediate response
 will be expected. If the student does not know the answer or his/her answer is
 insufficient, next question will be asked straight away. At least three areas from the
 following fields of microbiology will be discussed general microbiology,
 bacteriology, virology, mycology and clinical microbiology (specific antimicrobial
 treatment of infectious diseases).
- For students who will be tested online, the practical part of the exam will be substituted by an interpretation of microbiological results
- Software solution is to be specified (most probably ZOOM)
- The following rules must be adhered to in case of a face-to-face exam:
 - student must not have any no acute health problems that would suggest a viral infectious disease (e.g. fever, cough, shortness of breath, sudden loss of taste or smell, etc.)
 - hand sanitizer must be used when entering the examination room
 - student has not been ordered to be guarantined
 - student will provide a declaration that he/she is not experiencing any symptoms of a viral infectious disease
