

Terms and conditions of admissions procedure for study programmes General Medicine and Dentistry for the academic year 2024/2025

Electronic application: from 01 November 2023 to 31 July 2024

Application fee:

The fee of EUR 80 or its equivalent in a respective currency is to be paid by the applicant or an agency, which has contractual relation with the Faculty of Medicine and Dentistry UP or UP.

Payment details are stipulated in the electronic application.

Application fee is non-refundable.

Other documents required for application

- A document proving completed secondary education. If such document is not available at the time of application, the applicant will submit a confirmation of enrolment from his/her secondary school. In such case a document proving completed secondary education must be submitted by 31. 08. 2024 at the latest.
- English language certificate on a required level (FCE, IELTS, TOEFL, Psychometric Test, PTE Academic) optional
- 3) Letter of motivation
- 4) Passport a photocopy of a page with the photograph
- 5) Applicants with a health impairment, requiring special approach during the entrance examination are required to submit a medical report specifying the manner of his/her impairment and a request for adjustment of conditions of the entrance examination

Only complete applications submitted within the given deadline will be accepted. All documents related to the application should be submitted electronically no later than ten days prior to the selected entrance examination date.

Entrance examination dates:

Entrance examinations can be held from 01 January 2024 to 31 August 2024

Invitation for an entrance examination

Applicants/cooperating agencies will be sent invitations to take the entrance examination, provided that complete application was submitted on time. The invitation will contain detailed information regarding the entrance examination (date, time, venue, permitted aids).

Entrance examination

The entrance examination is carried out in English language and is done in form of a written test from three subjects. All applicants take a test from Chemistry and Biology, and as a third subject they choose between Physics and Mathematics.

The entrance exam is identical for both programmes of study - General Medicine and Dentistry. If the applicant applies for both programmes of study, he/she only takes the entrance examination once.

A language test forms a part of the entrance examination, and it is to be taken by applicants who have passed the subject tests. The language test is not to be taken by applicants, who acquired their secondary or tertiary education in an English speaking country, are studying a secondary school or a university in an English speaking country, or their secondary or tertiary education was carried out in English. Applicants who submit a certificate confirming they have passed a language examination on minimum B2 level according to CEFR (Common European Framework of Reference for Languages) are also exempt from the language test. The minimum required scores for such exemption are: FCE according to Cambridge English Language Assessment, IELTS – 6, TOEFL – 87 or PTE (Pearson Test of English) Academic min. 59. Applicants from Israel who submit a certificate confirming they have successfully passed the Psychometric Entrance Test (PET) or the Academic English course organised by MD International Studies (accredited by the Israeli Ministry of Education) are also exempt from the language test.

Another part of the entrance examination is an interview (see below).

The right to see entrance examination documents

An applicant has the right to see all materials relevant for decision about his/her acceptance for studies.

Appeal procedure

In accordance with the Higher Education Act no. 111/98 of the Coll., an applicant (or his/her representative with a power of attorney) has the right to submit a written request for a review of the Dean's decision. Appeal proceedings for the academic year 2024/2025 will be concluded by 04. 09. 2024.

Places made free by applicants, who are offered admission, but decide not to enrol for studies, will be offered to applicants who passed the entrance examination, but were originally not offered admission for capacity reasons.

Details about the written tests and the interview:

The written test from Chemistry, Biology, and Physics or Mathematics contains multiple choice questions. All questions are evaluated with one, two or zero points, and the result is converted to percentage. The minimum passing criteria is 165 percentage points as a total result for the three subject tests.

The language test contains 50 multiple choice questions. Each correct answer is evaluated with one point. The result is converted to percentage, and the minimum passing criteria is 60% of correct answers. The language test result is not part of the total score.



The interview assesses applicant's ability to effectively communicate in English as well as his/her study motivation and aptitude. It is assessed as "pass" or "fail" and the applicant can be given up to 30 points. A "pass" result from the interview is one of the conditions for an overall "pass" result of the entrance exam.
